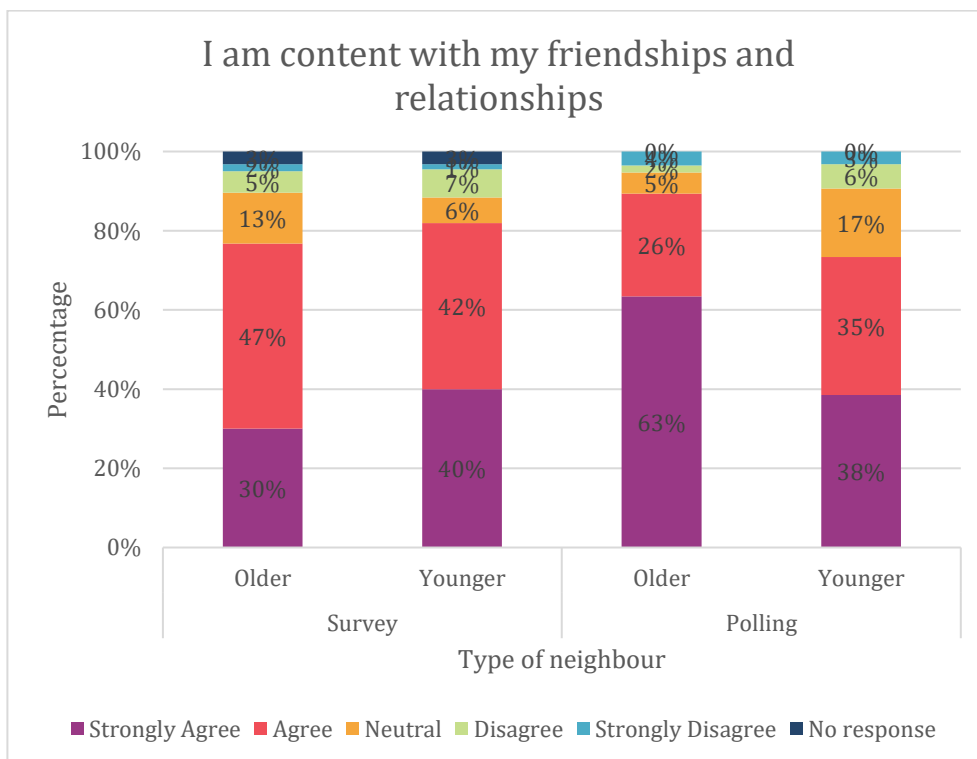

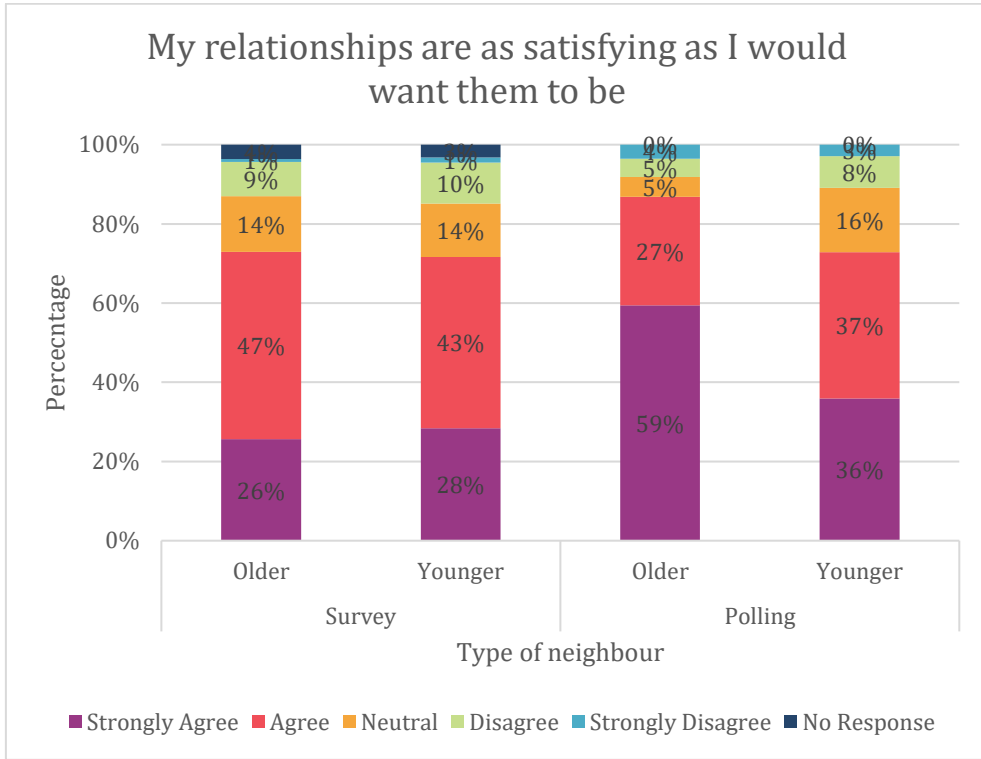

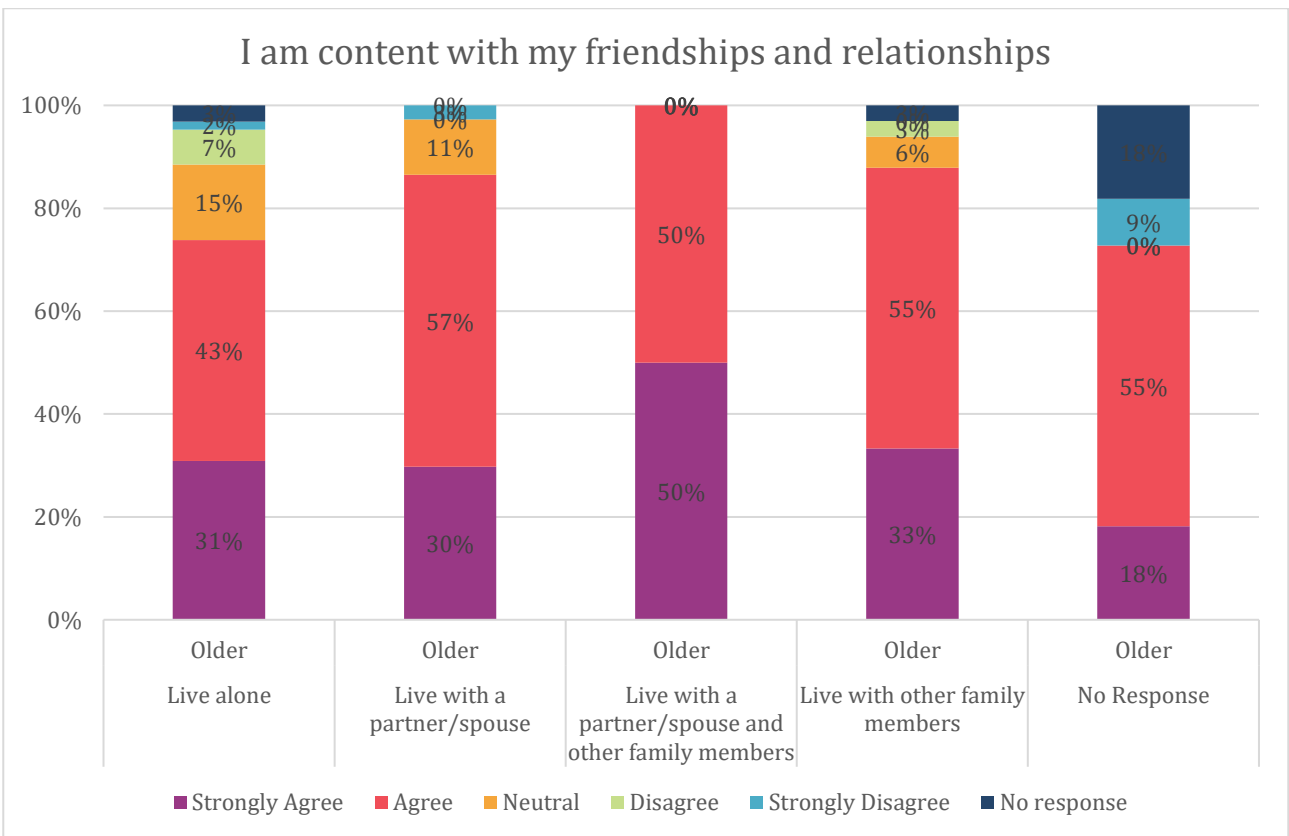

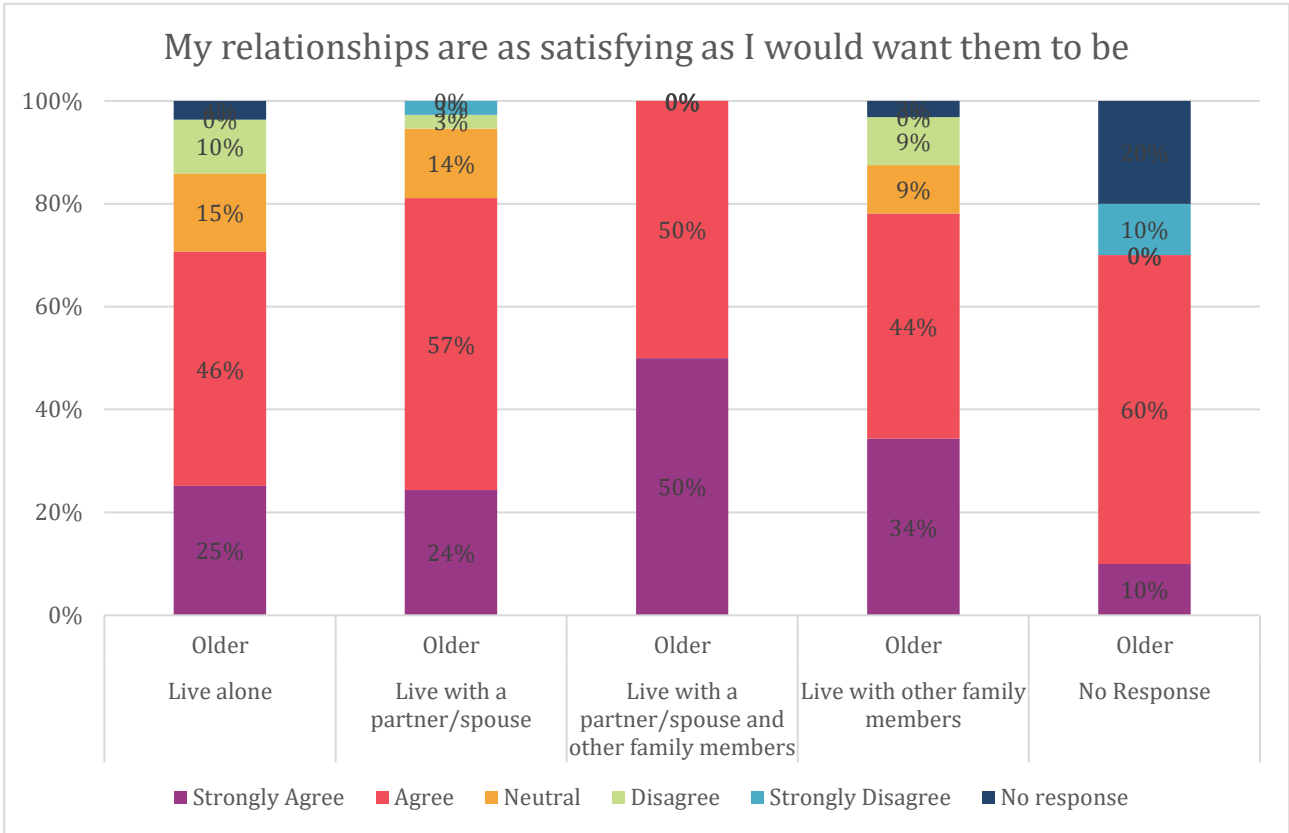
#### Younger and older neighbours – comparison to polling



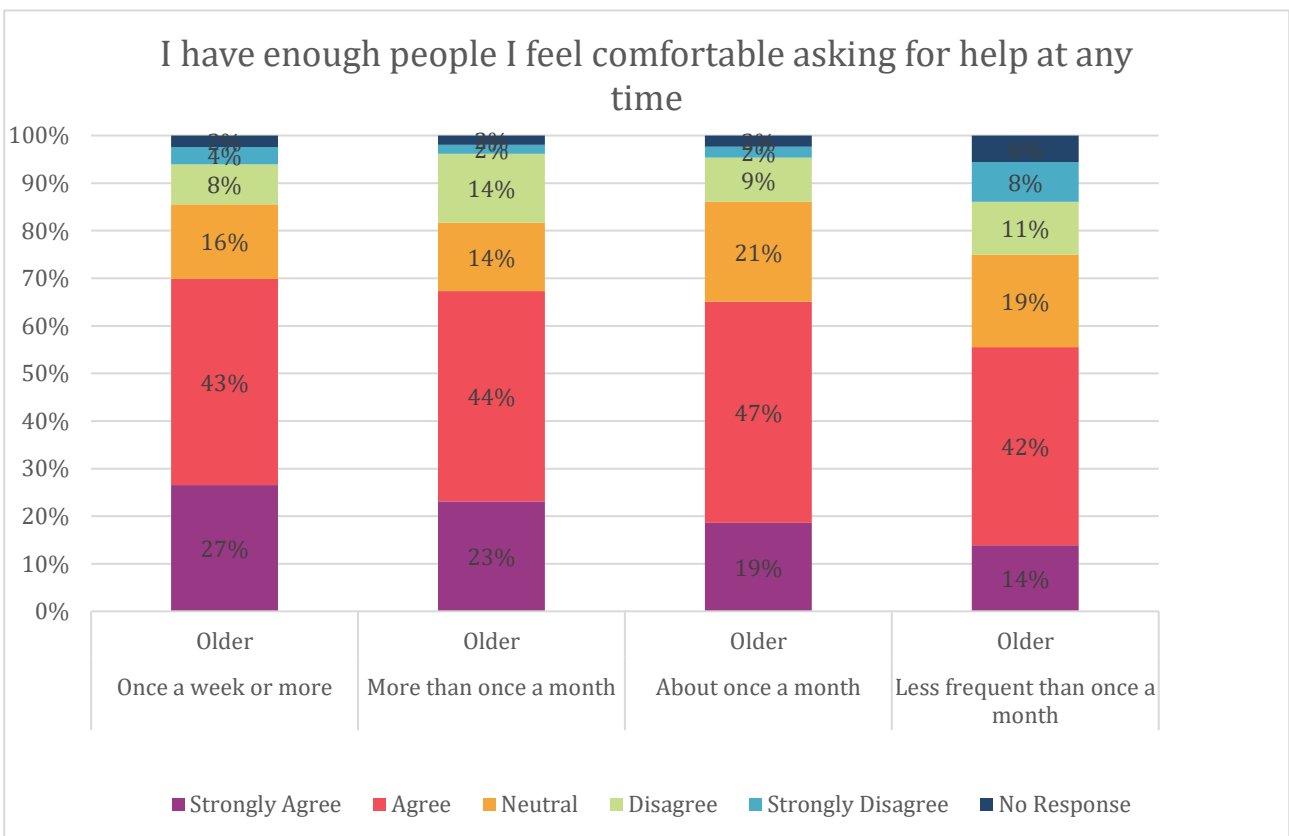


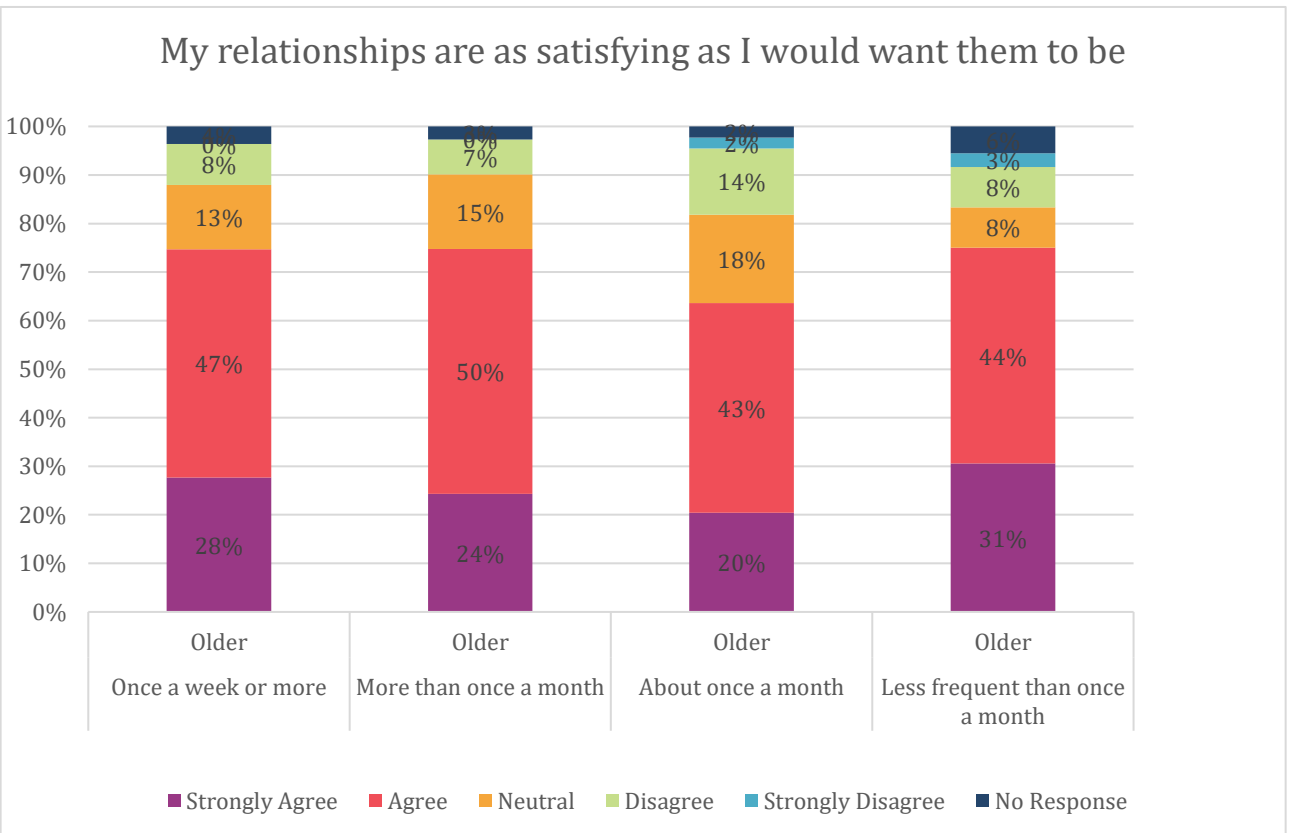
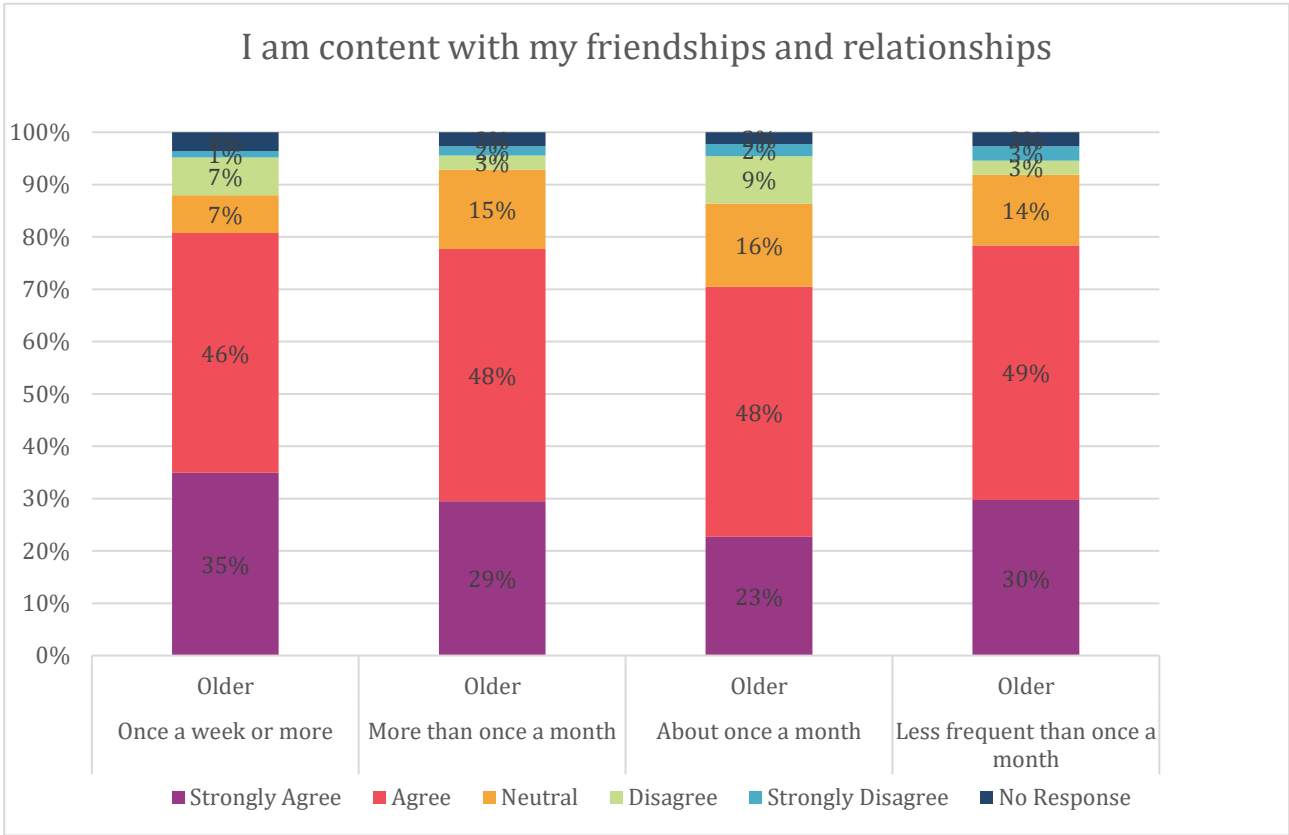
### Older neighbours – by living situation





### Older neighbours – frequency of interaction



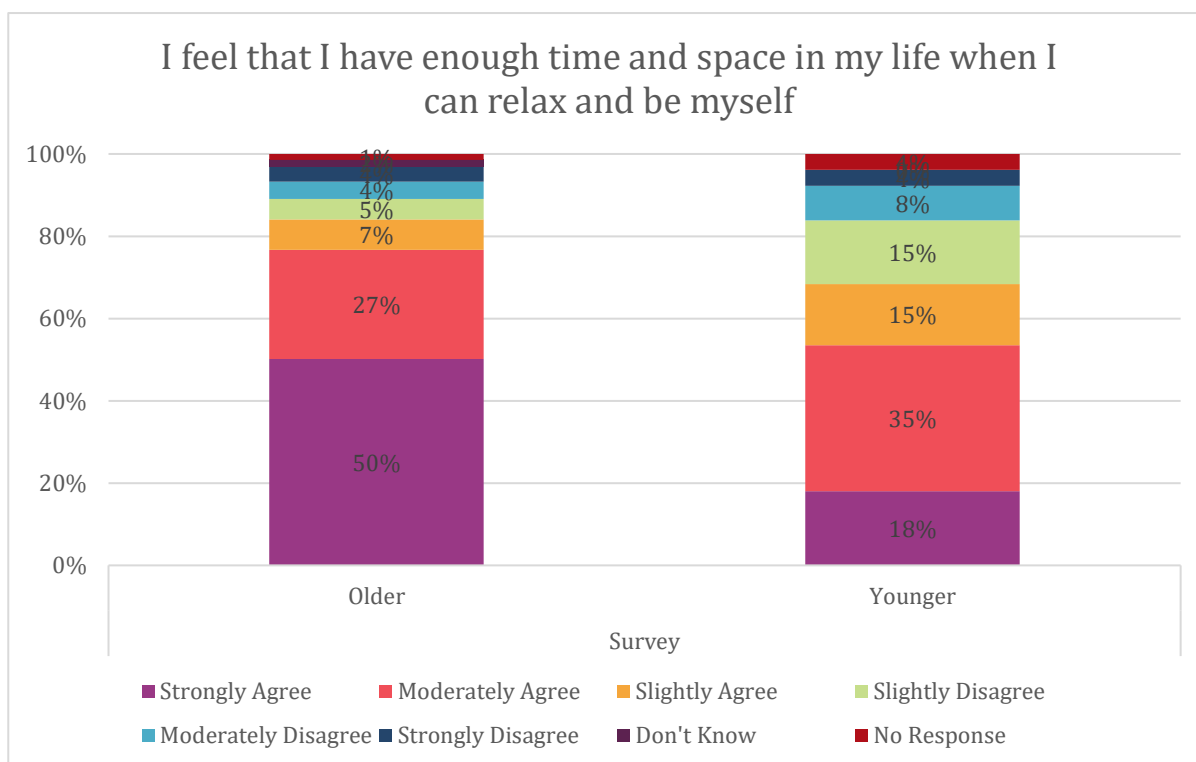


Older Neighbours - loneliness score by intensity of interaction

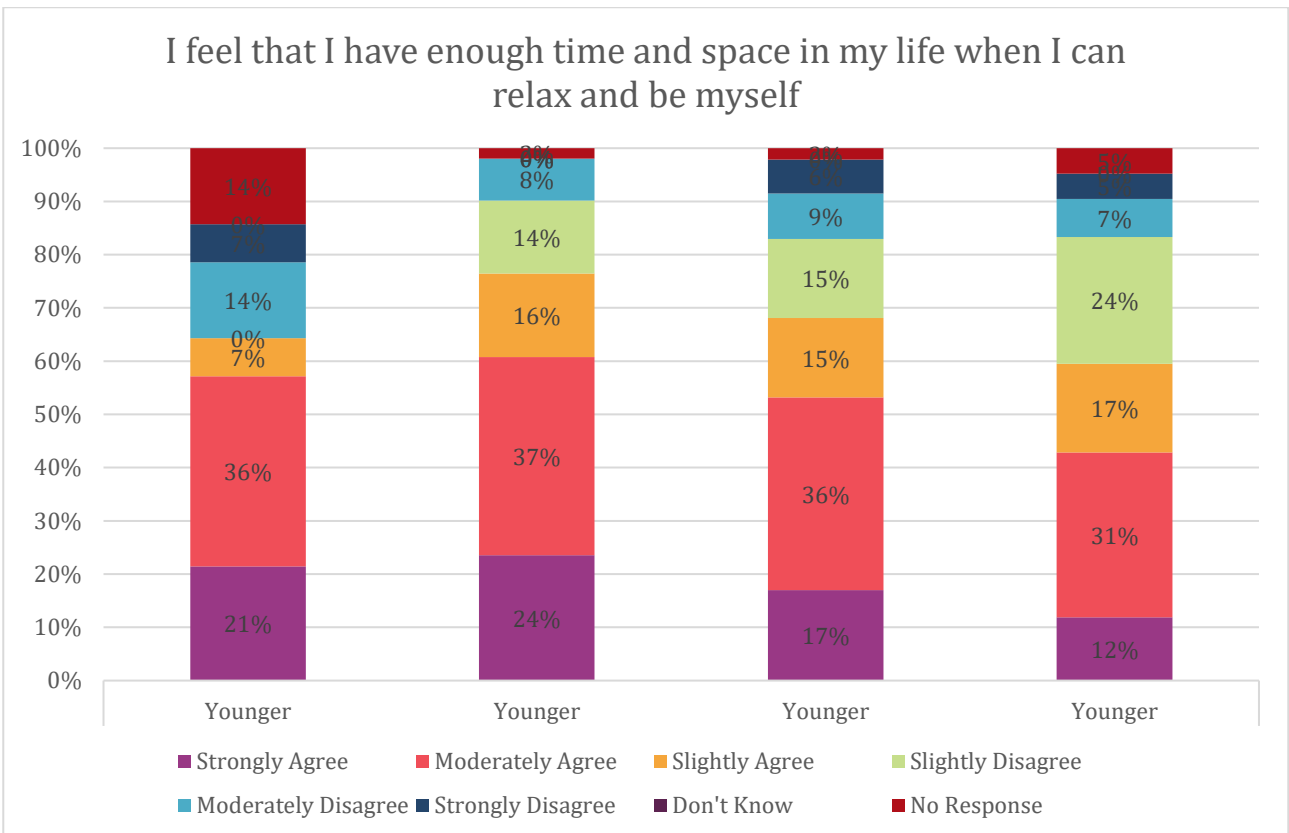
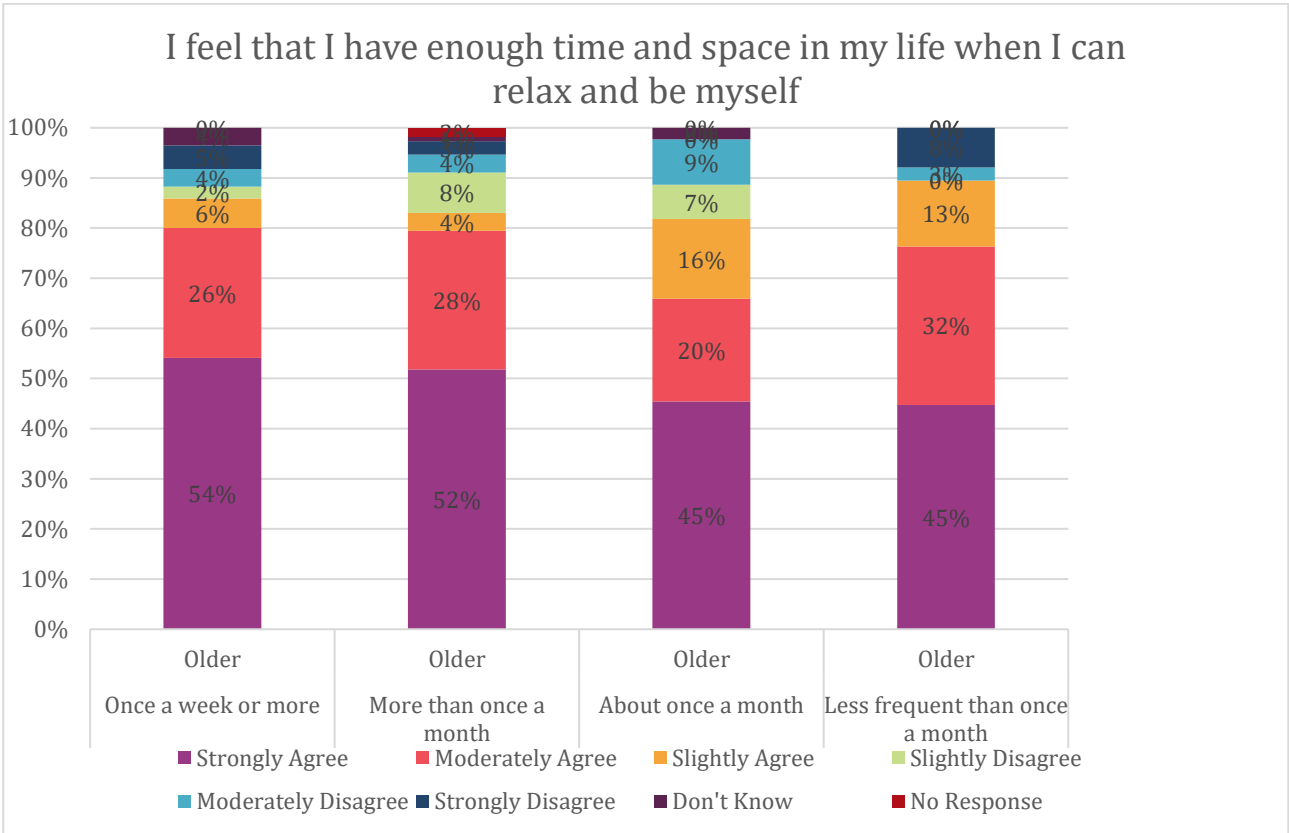
<i>Engagement</i>	<i>Average loneliness score</i> <i>0= least lonely, 12=most lonely</i>

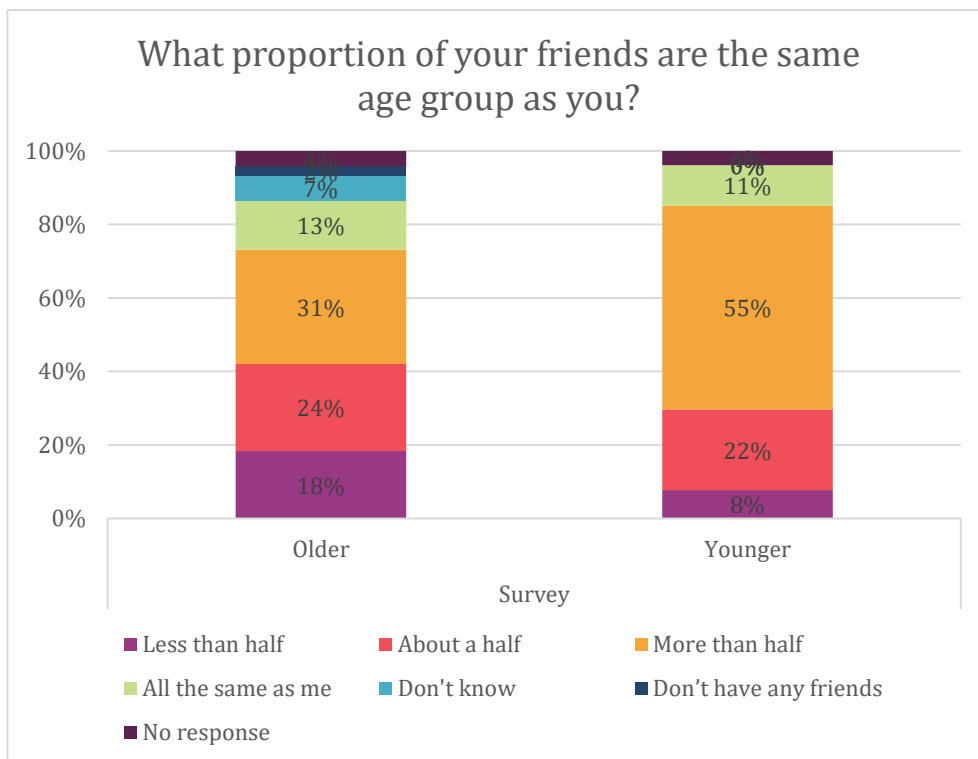
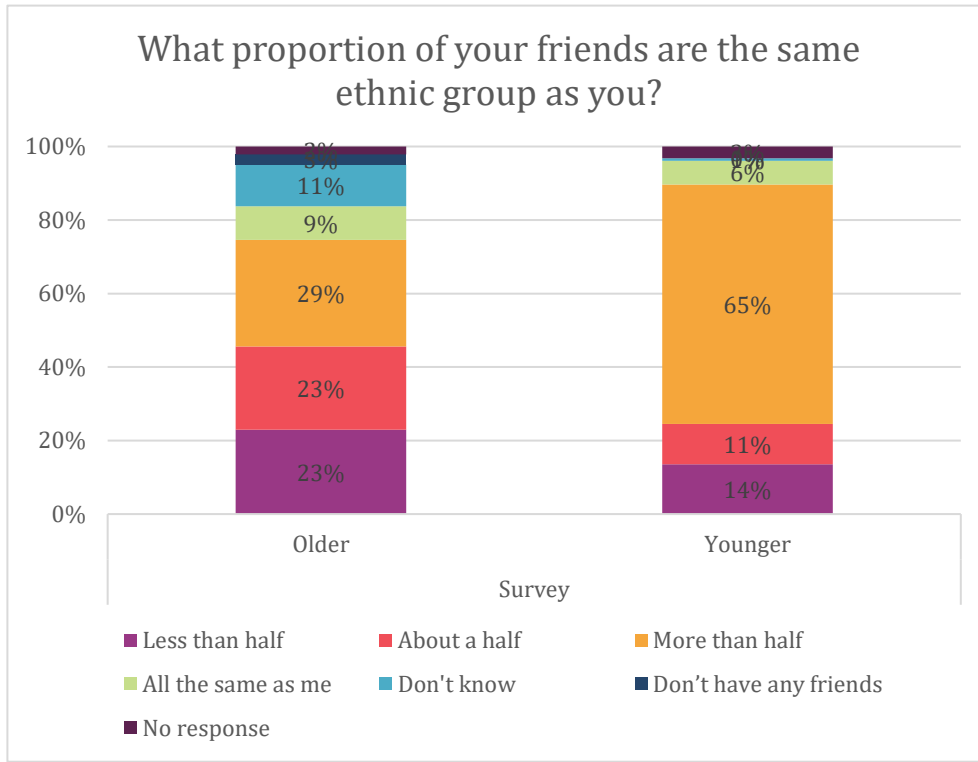


Older and younger neighbours – frequency of interactions
